## **Pool Play Seeding & Tie Breakers**

At the conclusion of Pool Play, all teams will be seeded based on their Pool Play results. Depending on the number of teams in the tournament, this seeding may determine:

- 1. Whether a team advances to single elimination play or not
- 2. Whether or not a team receives a BYE in a single elimination round
- 3. What opponent you get matched up against in single elimination round

## The methods for seeding and tiebreakers:

- 1. Pool Play Overall Record (winning percentage) NOTE: Ties = .5 wins
- 2. If two teams are tied: head-to-head winner gets better ranking.
- 3. If three or more teams are tied: if one team has defeated all others, that team gets better ranking. If not, continue to Step 4. If yes, loop back to Step 2 to break the two team tie.
- 4. Least runs allowed during pool play. Loop back to Step 2 to break remaining tie(s).
- 5. Net run differential during pool play. Loop back to Step 2 to break remaining tie(s).
- 6. Most runs scored during pool play. Loop back to Step 2 to break remaining tie(s).
- 7. Coin flip.
